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# ACAB'c in short

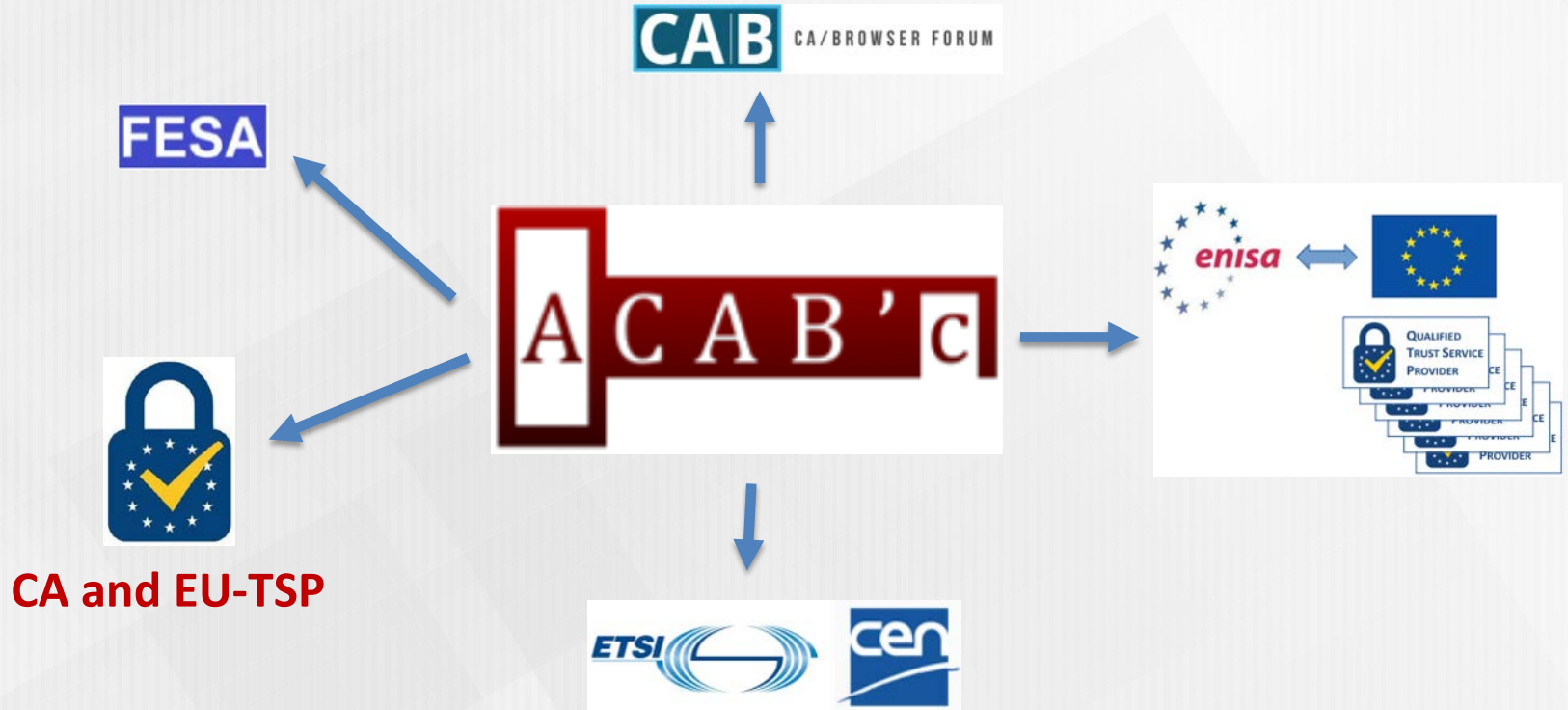
## Accredited Conformity Assessment Bodies – Council (association)

### Objective(s):

To harmonize amongst accredited conformity assessment bodies (CABs) a comparable/standardized application of conformity assessment requirements with respect to eIDAS

- To establish ACAB-c **Code of Conduct**: <https://www.acab-c.com/terms-conditions-and-policies/>
- To publish a **list of accredited CABs**: <https://www.acab-c.com/acab-c-members/>
- To encourage, promote and enable the **exchange of information** between the member organizations
- To produce and/or endorse **policy statements and position papers** on key issues such as technical on organizational standards and regulations which are of interest to third parties.

## ACAB'c services for ETSI Auditors/CAB

# ETSI qualified certificate policies and EV treatment

Repeated confusion about ETSI qualified policies and their relation to EV Guidelines

Different reasons, particularly

- „Re-use“ of documents with a different target community (e.g. eIDAS conformity assessment reports) for root store application
- Inaccurate wording from TSP's and their auditors

# ETSI qualified certificate policies and EV treatment

Qualified certificates for website authentication (QWAC) according to EU Regulation No. 910/2014 (eIDAS)

Keep in mind:

- No mandatory standard or policy defined by eIDAS regulation
  - No guarantee that ETSI norms or CABF guidelines have been applied during audit
- QWAC alone, without any other assertion, cannot be regarded as equal to EV.

# ETSI qualified certificate policies and EV treatment

## Policy QCP-w of ETSI EN 319 411-2

Defined for 2 different types of subscribers

### Certificate issued to a natural person

- Based on policy NCP of ETSI EN 319 411-1
  - No reference to EV requirements (and neither to BR)
- QCP-w certificate issued to a natural person cannot be regarded as equal to EV.

# ETSI qualified certificate policies and EV treatment

## Policy QCP-w of ETSI EN 319 411-2

Defined for 2 different types of subscribers

### Certificate issued to a legal person

- Based on policy EVCP of ETSI EN 319 411-1
  - Includes all EVCP requirements
- QCP-w certificate issued to a legal person is to be regarded as equal to EV  
(with only one potential caveat for PSD2 profiles)

# ETSI qualified certificate policies and EV treatment

## Conclusion

- In case of QCP-w, auditor must state that QCP-w including EVCP requirements are fulfilled:
  - That is, what e.g. Mozilla and Microsoft are already requiring.
  - Ensure that AA contains corresponding statement!

**ETSI TS 119 403-2 will be amended accordingly to clearly express that.**
